WBRC Centennial Scholarship

General Information

A competitive scholarship of \$1,000 is awarded annually to a Maine high school senior who is planning to study architecture or engineering (civil, structural, mechanical or electrical).

Student should be accepted to an architecture or engineering school that is recognized as an accredited college by the appropriate licensing group.

Application forms must be emailed to by May 1 to info@wbrcinc.com with the subject line "WBRC Scholarship."

Upon selection, the winning student's credentials will be verified by his or her high school guidance counselor.

The \$1,000 award check will be given to the winning recipient upon satisfactory completion of the first semester of post-secondary education and will be payable to the recipient.

Eligibility Criteria

The recipient must be accepted to, and must attend, a two- or four-year postsecondary educational institution with a major in architecture or engineering.

The recipient must have at least a 2.5 grade point average at the end of the first semester. An official grade transcript must be provided to Accounts Payable at brianne.beck@wbrcae.com within one month after grades are distributed.
